**HUGO DISTLER**, the German composer and organist living in the first half of this past century, was an important voice in church music. Born in Nuremberg in 1908, he attended Leipzig Conservatory and became organist at St. Jacobi in Lübeck in 1931. He also taught at the School for Church Music in Spandau, and became a professor of church music in Stuttgart in 1940. His choral work is polyphonic and frequently melismatic, often based on the pentatonic scale. This morning’s anthem takes a familiar hymn melody and presents it in a fresh, rhythmically altered form.

This group discussion class is for women with or without children who are interested in growing, learning, and sharing our faith together.

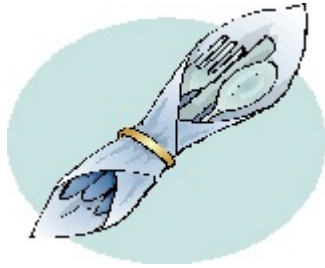
**Book of Confessions** (McKinnon Room) Leader: John Muntz
