FLOWERS IN THE SANCTUARY are given by the Tortorelli family in loving memory of Peter's parents, Flora and Joseph Tortorelli.

THE ITALIAN COMPOSER LODOVICO VIADANA (1560-1627), also a teacher, choirmaster, and Franciscan friar, wrote mostly sacred music. During the earlier part of his career his works were a *cappella*, in Renaissance style. Later, however, he adopted the new technique of figured bass, or continuo, which marks the beginning of the Baroque era. In music history he is important for being the first composer of significance to employ this technique, which involves an instrumental bass line with notations to indicate what chords to play. This morning's offertory anthem at 9:00, an aria with continuo accompaniment, has music that heightens the drama of the text, moving suddenly from a sorrowful supplication to a dance-like outpouring of praise.
