**HEINRICH SCHEIDEMANN**, a student of the great Dutch organist and composer Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck, served as organist at St. Catherine's in Hamburg, beginning his tenure in 1625 as he succeeded his father. Following the younger Scheidemann the post would be held by J. A. Reinken (J. S. Bach made several visits to Hamburg as a teenager to hear Reinken play and improvise.). This morning's prelude reminds us of Sweelinck's influence on Scheidemann, as we hear rhythmically shifted sequential and "echo" passages so typical of the former's work (you may recall last Sunday's Sweelinck echo fantasia).
