THIS MORNING'S INTROIT is, in the composer's words, a "dramatic reading" and it sets the Pentecost narrative with handbells rung randomly (perhaps evoking the visitation of tongues of fire) and a pair of sustained, low organ pitches creating vibrations more felt than heard. The choir sings the ancient chant "Veni Creator," lending another layer of mysticism and celebration. It is this same chant on which this morning's postlude is based. The offertory today is twentieth-century English composer Herbert Howells' setting of his own hymn tune "Salisbury." Its lyrical lines glide on his expressive harmonies. Our thanks to Bettie Mason for finding this piece and bringing it to Peter Van Eenam's attention.

PETER VAN EENAM is away the next two Sundays as he will be on vacation/study leave in London, Paris, Belgium, and the Netherlands with his younger daughter, Kathryn, who is finishing her exams at University College London. Aside from the fun of just hanging out together they will eventually get to the village of Noordbroek (in northeastern Holland) and visit Peter Westerbrink, organist of the church and a former recitalist on Westminster's *Musica Organi* series. While in Noordbroek Peter will have the opportunity to play the magnificent organ by the North German master Arp Schnitger, built in 1696 and to a very large extent in original condition. Peter and Kathryn will then bike to five other nearby villages with similar instruments (all built between 1531 and 1795), including Appingedam, Godlinze, Krewerd, Zeerijp, and Zuidbroek (the builders include Albertus Anthoni Hinsz, Arp's sons' successor at the shop; Hinsz' successors Franz Caspar Schnitger, Jr. and Heinrich Hermann Freytag; and Theodorus Faber). These are the very types of organs that inspired the work of Ralph Richards and Bruce Fowkes as they designed and built Westminster's instrument. Our thanks to Eileen Rudd for serving as organist while Peter is away.
