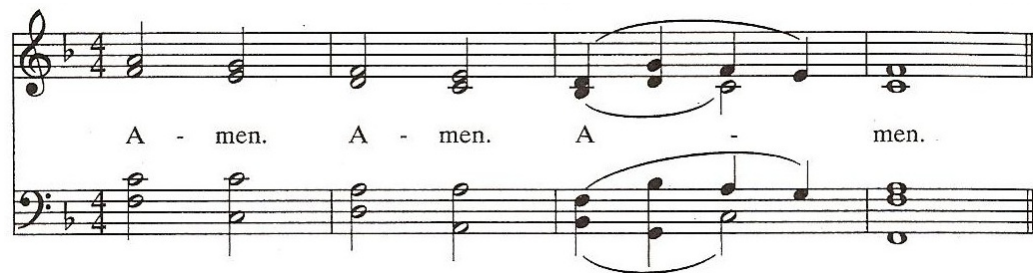

THE BIRTH CANDLE TODAY represents the birth of Anna Fromson Van Beke was born Saturday, June 12 to Jill and Chris Van Beke. Anna weighs 6 pounds, 12 ounces and is 18.5 inches long. Jill and Anna are doing great. Linda Van Beke is the proud grandmother! Congratulations!

RICHARD FARRANT (c. 1530-1580) was a composer of English church music, choirmaster, playwright, and theatrical producer noted for creating the Blackfriars Theatre that hosted children's companies. He became a gentleman of the Chapel Royal during the reign of Edward VI, but resigned the post in 1564 on being appointed master of the children at St. George's Chapel, Windsor. He became Master of the Chapel Royal in 1569, holding this post concurrently with that at Windsor. This morning's anthem, one of his few surviving works, is thought to possibly be the work of the elder John Hilton, though Hilton's version includes an amen at its conclusion.
