THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE is comprised of Austrian music. Johannes Brahms composed this chorale prelude at Ischl, Austria (near Salzburg), during the last summer of his life, as part of a set of eleven chorales. Anton Bruckner, Brahms' contemporary, known more for his symphonies and choral works, was a renowned organist and a teacher of music theory at the Vienna Conservatory and later at Vienna University. He composed this short prelude in 1884.
