CALL TO CONFESSION

Psalm 51:1-17 (responsive)



Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving kindness; in your great compassion, blot out my offenses. Wash me through and through from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin. *Refrain*.

For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight.

And so you are justified when you speak and upright in your judgement.

Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth, a sinner from my mother's womb. *Refrain*.

For behold, you look for truth deep within me, and will make me understand wisdom secretly. Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

Make me hear of joy and gladness,

and the body you have broken may rejoice.

Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities.

hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, our self-indulgent appetites and ways and our exploitation of other people, our intemperate love of worldly

goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

People: we confess to you, O God.

Leader: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the

faith that is in us,

People: we confess to you, O God.

Leader: Accept our repentance, O God, for the wrongs we have done. For our

neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and

cruelty,

People: accept our repentance, O God.

Leader: For all false judgements and uncharitable thoughts, and for our prejudice

and contempt toward those who differ from us,

People: accept our repentance, O God.

Leader: For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for

those who come after us,

People: accept our repentance, O God.

 $Leader: \qquad Restore \ us, O \ God, \ and \ let \ your \ anger \ depart \ from \ us.$

People: Favorably hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.
