LOUIS-NICOLAS CLÉRAMBAULT, a contemporary of J. S. Bach, was organist at St. Sulpice in Paris, where Charles-Marie Widor would later serve. French composers have always been good about including registrations (what stops and sounds to use) in their organ music. The "Grands Jeux" in the title of the postlude is an indication to the organist to use reeds and mutation stops (those speaking at the third or fifth to the note being played), resulting in a vibrant and colorful sound. Even with Westminster's German reeds (generally less fiery than their French counterparts), the effect is grand. An interesting and uncommon feature of Clérambault's writing is the inclusion of rolled chords, something we usually associate with harpsichord and piano music. Rolling a chord (slightly arpeggiating the onset of each note) is a way to emphasize a chord and add expression.

In November 1938 in Nazi Germany, Trudy was just 6 years old when she experienced the frightful intimidation call Kristallnacht, night of the broken glass. Soon thereafter, Trudy and her family left Germany for Cuba, and later Florida and New York. Some of Trudy's extended family did not escape Nazi Germany and were put to death in concentration camps. In 1998, Trudy returned to Germany for the first time and went back to the house where she experienced Kristallnacht. She was welcomed by a younger generation of Germans, many of whom were not aware that their grandfather was a part of the Nazi regime until they found his Nazi uniforms in his closet.
