<u>OUR THANKS</u> to Barbara Adamcik, Helen Bryenton, Robert Ingram, and Carl Whipple for their enrichment of our worship this morning as they accompany the offertory anthem. Fauré masterfully achieves profound beauty with an economy of material: the initial melody is comprised of just four notes and he writes in a simple and sublime two-part vocal texture with an ethereal violin countermelody that recurs with each of the men's phrases. Every detail is subtle: the color of muted violin, a mysterious "tension" underlying the harmonic inflection of the choral lines, even the shapes of the lines. Fauré gradually lengthens the phrases and moves towards a most glorious and majestic climax, including the brass, playing a powerful yet simple motive, before ending the work with the choir in warm six-part chords and violin reaching towards the heavens.
