DANIEL MOE (1926-2012) was a leading American choral conductor and composer, having led, most notably, the choirs at the University of Iowa from 1961 to 1972 and Oberlin College from 1972 to 1992. A wonderfully creative, insightful, and warm person, I had the privilege of singing under him at a summer conference for church musicians at Montreat in 1982, where I first became acquainted with this morning's anthem. It is a vibrant and inviting setting of William Penn's text, rhythmically active and in mixed meter, with a driving and energetic opening followed by imitation and even some music that dances—a lot of musical ideas in a short span! It was first sung by the Chancel Choir on May 12, 1985.
