FLOWERS IN THE SANCTUARY are given by Paula Hogan in honor of her mother, Marjorie Hogan on her 80th birthday.

ORGANIST AND COMPOSER HENRY LOOSEMORE was born around 1600 in Devonshire, England, the son of an organbuilder. He was appointed organist at King's College, Cambridge, in 1627 and graduated from Cambridge University in 1640. From 1652 to 1660 he was resident organist at Kirtling, Cambridgeshire, afterwards becoming organist of Exeter Cathedral. He returned to Cambridge to spend the last years of his life in the service of King's College before his death in 1670. This morning's motet, formerly attributed to the great Orlando Gibbons, shows Loosemore's fine contrapuntal skill.

THE CHANCEL CHOIR, accompanied by a chamber ensemble, will sing John Rutter's Requiem on Sunday morning, March 6. The choir and I have enjoyed preparing this lovely work over a number of months and look forward to sharing it with you in worship that morning!
