HOW CAN I KEEP FROM SINGING was written and published by American Baptist minister Robert Lowry in the 1869 songbook, "Bright Jewels for the Sunday School." The first known publication of the words was on August 7, 1868, in The New York Observer, titled "Always Rejoicing," and attributed to "Pauline T." The words we are singing today are very similar to the original but with some changes from more recent versions. During the twentieth-century, this hymn was not widely used in congregational worship but Pete Seeger revived the song for the 1960's folk era. Then the song received new prominence in 1991 again with Irish musician Enya. Though it is not, in fact, a Quaker hymn as Pete Seeger claimed, twentieth-century Quakers adopted it as their own and use it widely today.
