ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP SERVICE

You are invited to join us in the Sanctuary on Wednesday evening, February 26th at 7:00 as we begin our journey toward Easter. The season of Lent continues for 40 days, not counting Sundays, and prepares us for the celebration of the resurrection of Christ.

JOHN WEAVER was the head of the Organ Department at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia from 1972 to 2003, Chair of the Organ Department at The Juilliard School from 1987 to 2004, and Director of Music at Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City from 1970 to 2005. This morning's musical prayer combines mysticism in the harmonies at various points, lyrical vocal lines heard in imitation, and a homophonic middle section which grows through both volume and harmonic shifts. Underlying all of this is a lush organ accompaniment of undulating "cluster" chords in the modern French style.
