FLOWERS IN THE SANCTUARY are given by Anne Davidson in honor of all of healers of mind, body and spirit.

GIOVANNI FRANCESCO ANERIO, an Italian composer of the late Renaissance and early Baroque, was the younger brother of choral composer Felice Anerio. Giovanni played a key role in the early development of the oratorio, and though he is considered to be more progressive than others within the otherwise conservative Roman School, he also shared some of the stylistic tendencies of his brother, who was much indebted to the *stile antico* associated with Palestrina.

What's your spiritual gift?

According to Romans 12, "We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness."

Ephesians 4 says it this way: "The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

In I Corinthians, we're told this: "To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues."

So what's your gift? While this might seem like an assortment of character traits you might not see in yourself, the reality is that you have a gift (and likely more than one!). The church counts on it, and can't operate without your using your gifts in service.

We're going to be thinking and talking about gifts over the next few weeks. Then, we'll all get the exciting opportunity to decide how we can use our gifts to benefit Westminster, our community, and beyond! "We have gifts." Praise God!
