BENEDETTO MARCELLO, born in Venice in 1686, was a contemporary of J. S. Bach. In addition to his work as a composer, librettist, and writer on music, he was educated in law. The composer of cantatas and oratorios, as well as concertos and sonatas, he is perhaps best known for his 50 psalm paraphrases, published between 1724 and 1727, from which this morning's aria comes.
