JOSEF GABRIEL RHEINBERGER (1839-1901), a composer and organist, was born in Vaduz, Liechtenstein, though he spent most of his life and career in Germany. He exhibited prodigious musical talent, and he was already serving as organist of the Vaduz parish church when he was only seven years old. Soon after graduating from the Munich Conservatorium, he returned there to become a professor of both piano and composition. His music exhibits stylistic influences ranging from Bach to Mendelssohn, Schubert, and Schumann; and extending to his contemporaries Brahms and Bruckner. As a teacher, he attracted students from across Europe, including Richard Strauss and Ermanno Wolf-Ferrari, but also from the United States, among them Horatio Parker and George Whitefield Chadwick. Though Rheinberger wrote twelve masses, a Requiem, a Stabat Mater, symphonies, and chamber works, he is perhaps best known today for his organ works. In the Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians it is noted that "His organ sonatas were once declared to be undoubtedly the most valuable addition to organ music since the time of Mendelssohn." When the second (and present) Munich Conservatorium was founded, Rheinberger was appointed Royal Professor of organ and composition, a post he held until his death.

#### LENT AT WESTMINSTER

We are about to enter the season of Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday - this year on March 2 - and we mark that day with imposition of ashes and the words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The season of Lent lasts for 40 days or about six weeks, not counting Sundays. Lent is a time for reflection as we approach the days marking Jesus's last days, his death, and his resurrection. Those final days include Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. The 40 days end on the Saturday before Easter.

This year we will offer a contemplative "self-guided" Ash Wednesday service, similar to the one we offered last year. If the weather is good, we will be in the Ruthie Carey Pavilion. If the weather is too chilly, we will move into the sanctuary but still be self-guided as we walk around the room, reflecting on various scriptures, prayers, or objects. You may drop in any time between noon and 2:00 p.m. That same day, we will have a more traditional Ash Wednesday service in the sanctuary at 5:30 p.m. We will also be offering a weekly Lenten study and prayer service. Rev. Gradye Parsons will lead the study using his book, Open to Me the Gates and we will end each week with a time of evening prayer. The study/prayer service will be each Wednesday during Lent (March 9 - April 6) at 5:30 p.m. On Maundy Thursday, we will gather for a traditional Maundy Thursday/Tenebrae service at 7:00 p.m.
