The Interim Pastor Search Committee is very pleased to announce that the Rev. Dr. Anne McKee, a friend to many at Westminster Presbyterian Church, has accepted the position of Interim Pastor. Dr. McKee, who has served in several pastoral and church related positions in over 35 years of ministry and has been most recently the Campus Minister at Maryville College, will bring to our congregation the kind of in-depth experience that will help us in this transitional period. The committee talked with several of her colleagues and associates about what Dr. McKee will bring to Westminster, and they all agreed that she is the one for the job. She will inspire us from the pulpit, be engaging on a personal level with both staff and the congregation, and help us create a vision that will guide Westminster toward a promising future. Dr. McKee's covenant has been approved by Session. Subject to final approval by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry, she will be on the job beginning April 11, and will be in the pulpit on Easter Sunday.


