THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE is a lovely setting of the ancient chorale melody to which Martin Luther added his metrical paraphrase of The Lord's Prayer.

Scheidemann's ornamentation of the melody is replete with echo-like passages (though not on two different manuals) and florid, scalar lines exploring the tenor range through the treble. Typically, this solo line would be played on stops found in a division of the organ perched on the balcony railing directly behind the organist. This solo color would often include the Sesquialtera II. In our instrument this stop is found on the Swell and it is comprised of two ranks (sets) of pipes speaking substantially higher than the note played, one an octave and a fifth and the other two octaves and a third. This "double-draw" stop has an extra degree of versatility in that the lower rank can be used by itself if the stop knob is drawn halfway (the upper rank is added when the knob is fully drawn). This is another instance of the ingenuity with which our stoplist and organ were designed. The Sesquialtera can also be combined with a 2' rank to help create the integral part of a cornet, a vivid registration (a group of stops) containing 8', 4', 2 2/3', 2', and 1 3/5'.

A CHAMBER RECITAL will be held on Thursday, April 7 at 7:30 pm in the sanctuary. Cindy Emory, harp; Hillary Herndon, viola; Maria Castillo Rodriquez, flute; and Andy Bryenton, cello; will be performing works by Bax, Ravel, and Debussy. There is no entrance fee. Please come enjoy the music!

**LENT AT WESTMINSTER:** We are offering a weekly Lenten study and prayer service. Rev.
