<u>THE BIRTH CANDLE</u> is lit today in celebration of Jackson Robert Piel. Born April 9 to parents Jenn and Natty Piel, and big sister Claire.

GERALD NEAR, one of this country's finest composers of sacred music, received much of his musical education at the University of Michigan, where he studied theory and composition with Leslie Bassett, organ with Robert Glasgow, and conducting with Elizabeth Green and Gustav Meier. This morning's anthem sets the beautiful melody familiar to us as a hymn with gracefully flowing counterpoint in the accompaniment. The third verse, rich with warm harmonies, is sung without accompaniment, leading to the final verse, accompanied by the serene string celeste and solo flute. We hear a recording of our Chancel Choir singing this lovely work for a meeting (program) of the Knoxville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists in October 1991 at First Baptist Church, Knoxville.

<u>Adult Bible Study</u> class chooses books of the Bible for in-depth study each Sunday. The class meets in person in the McKinnon Room AND on Zoom.


