THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE is typical of the North German repertoire and its improvisatory style. Vincent Lübeck, living from around 1654 to 1740, is believed to have studied with Caspar Förckelrath and Dieterich Buxtehude, going on to serve as organist at two very well-known churches with organs by the master organbuilder Arp Schnitger, St. Cosmae et Damiani, Stade, and the Nikolaikirche, Hamburg. It was while in Hamburg that he was heard by the young J. S. Bach, visiting from Middle Germany.
