THIS MORNING'S ANTHEM is a setting of the ancient chant for Pentecost which dates from my earliest years at Westminster Church. I was becoming more familiar and enamored with the motets of Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986), organist of Saint-Étienne-du-Mont in Paris, and eager to emulate his harmonic style, using his settings of chant as a model. Three arrangements of chant were the result: *O lux beata Trinitas* (1982), *Pange lingua* (1983), and *Veni Creator* (1983).
