Leader: When our senses are deadened by the sales pitches of our culture: **People:** it is enough, for us, that God wraps us in the silence of grace.



HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED what the BWV number by the title of a work by J. S. Bach is all about? BWV stands for *Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis* (Bach Works Catalogue) and is the numbering system used to identify each of his over 1000 works. This system was devised in 1950 as a thematical catalogue by Wolfgang Schmieder, meaning that the works are arranged by type rather than chronologically, due in part to the fact that many of Bach's works do not have a known date of composition.
