<u>WESTMINSTER CHORISTERS</u> (Grades 7 through 12) starts rehearsals this afternoon at 4:00.

<u>THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE</u> exhibits the contrapuntal mastery of the North German organist and composer Dieterich Buxtehude. It begins in typical fashion with the traditional canzona thematic elements and rhythm followed by entrances of each of the two accompanying voices with the same material, similar to a canon. Interestingly, this opening theme is then inverted to be the basis of the second section. Even more amazing is that Buxtehude then skillfully combines both the original and inverted forms of the theme in the third and final section!

WESTMINSTER 101: Are you interested in learning more about Westminster, whether as a visitor, new member, or long-time member? Next Sunday, Sept. 18, we will start a four-week adult class during the Sunday School hour, Westminster 101, in the Pavilion, weather permitting. IN THE SCHILLING GALERY for the months of September and October, we have two artists displaying their work. It is exciting when a child of our congregation has developed into a nationally recognized artist.
