TOMÁS LUIS DE VICTORIA (1548-1611), one of the most well-known and prolific composers of the late Renaissance in Spain, was born in Sanchidrián, where he became a choirboy at the cathedral and also studied organ. After receiving a grant from Philip II in 1565, he went to Rome and later became cantor at the Collegium Germanicum. It is thought Victoria may have studied with Palestrina around this time, though this is only circumstantial. Beginning in 1573, Victoria held two positions, one being at the German College and the other at the Roman Seminary. In 1587 he returned to Spain to serve as chaplain and organist to Philip's sister, the Empress María, living in retirement at the Monasterio de las Descalzas de S Clara in Madrid.

About 250 families come to this pantry for food each day it operates. The pantry address is: 122 W. Scott Avenue (half block off Central Ave., near I-275). STEWARDSHIP UPDATE: We have received 153 pledges out of 254 households so far for a total of \$ 766,885.00. To compare - last year's final tally of contributions was 167 pledges out of 273 households for a total of \$835,161.
