



FRENCH COMPOSER AND CONDUCTOR, Hector Berlioz (1803-1869), is perhaps best known for several of his orchestral works, including Symphonie fantastique and the Roman Carnival Overture, though his output also includes choral pieces and operas. This morning's work is interesting in its use of three different "subjects" (a short musical phrase) to develop (compose) a fugue.
