

THIS MORNING'S MUSIC FOR HANDBELLS is a very creative setting of the hymn we know well. Aside from techniques of articulation, including thumb damping and pizzicato, a number of passages ask for notes (particularly in the accompaniment) to be held out for a specific duration past their printed value, resulting in an effect similar to what a damper pedal creates on a piano. The arranger also uses many different accompaniments and rhythms throughout the course of the work.
